Glass packaging

- Empty and dry non-deposit glass jars and bottles from households.
- **Remove** caps and lids from glass packaging and sort them by their material.
- **Glass packaging only!** Drinking glasses and oven dishes, for example, are not packaging. They are also unsuitable for recycling due to the material they are made of.



Metal

- Empty and dry metal packaging from households, such as food cans, metal lids and aluminium trays.
- You can also bring **small metal items** such as frying pans, nails and aluminium tea light cases to the eco-take back point.



Is it packaging? Metal, plastic, cardboard or glass?

If the answer is yes, you can take it to a Rinki eco take-back point or to a collection container at the building where you live. You'll do well with these sorting instructions!

Cardboard packaging

- Empty and dry cardboard packaging from households, such as cardboard boxes, milk and juice cartons and paper bags.
- You can **flatten and stack** cardboard packages inside each other to save space at home and in the collection container.

Plastic packaging

- Empty and dry plastic packaging from households, such as yoghurt tubs, laundry detergent packaging and plastic bags.
- **Unsure of the material?** Do the scrunch test: if the packaging returns to its original shape after it has been scrunched, it is mostly plastic and it can be recycled with plastic packaging.
